Loyola University New Orleans and Colegio Americano de Quito alumni Andres Munoz is working with Council On Alcohol and Drug Abuse to promote their program to potential charter schools and supporters within the greater New Orleans area.

The work comes as part of Munoz' advertising capstone class at Loyola University New Orleans. Alongside four other Loyola students, Munoz will help develop a comprehensive advertising campaign for CADA to implement in Spring 2016.

CADA is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit health organization that serves to support those going through substance abuse rehabilitation in order to aid in the treatment process and educate the community about substance abuse. Their primary mission is to prevent addiction and encourage a healthy lifestyle. CADA provides services including prevention, assessment, intervention, information and referrals for all ages.
